

#### AN EARLY NOTICE!

Preparation of a New Electoral Roll this year: According to the Church Representation Rules of the Church of England, each parish has to prepare a new electoral roll every six years. What this means in brief, is that everyone comes off the existing Church Roll and if you wish to be on the Electoral Roll you will need to complete an Electoral Roll form.

The Electoral Roll is the basic list in every parish of all those entitled to vote on elections within the Church of England. Those entitled to have their names on the roll have to be 16 years of age or more and they must reside in the parish or worship regularly in the parish church.

Formal notice of the 'Start of the Preparation of a new Electoral Roll' will be pinned to our noticeboard on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> February. More information will follow. If you have any questions, or would like to know more, then do talk to Hendrika, our Electoral Roll Officer.
