

Corona Virus Update for Churches:

As the coronavirus continues to take hold in our city and in our country, in line with instructions from the Bishop of London and our Archbishops, **Holy Communion will be given in one kind** (the consecrated bread only) today and at each Holy Communion Service until further notice.

We will also no longer **shake hands or exchange other physical contact during the sharing of the peace.** I will demonstrate a way in which we can share the peace this morning which meets the above requirement but am open to ideas from you.

Regular and thorough handwashing is one of the key things we can do to limit the spread of this virus. The National Guidance is to wash our hands thoroughly for 20 seconds – now I know singing Happy Birthday twice has been mooted as a time reference, but I offer the 'Lord's Prayer as an alternative.

I invite you also to hold in your prayers all who have been affected by the coronavirus, those in isolation because of it, and for the health care workers and authorities who are doing what they can to combat the spread of infection. I would also ask you to pray for continuing compassion and care and for common sense and good will to prevail.
