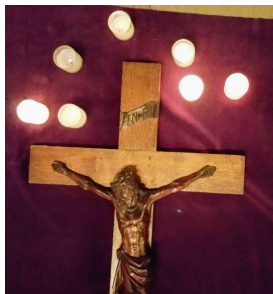

Zoom in and find out what our brothers and sisters are doing in different parts of the world about climate change – **we may get ideas about what we can do.**

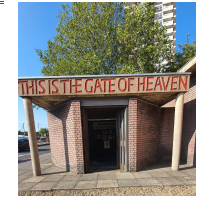
This week Safia will be leading the second session 'Creation'.

Returning to worshipping together in

church: Sunday 21st March. At Christmas we decided to close St Paul's Bow Common for worship in response to the new highly infectious variant and the high levels of infection in our city and borough at the time.



The situation has changed: the vaccine roll-out is having an impact on the infection rate and most of our elders and vulnerable people have received their vaccination. Taking these and other factors into consideration we plan to re-open for in person worship at our **10am Holy Communion Service on Sunday 21 March.** We will still offer an on-line service for anyone who cannot come to church.



We will gather how we did before Christmas, observing covid safety guidelines, ie: maintaining social distancing, wearing a face covering and sanitizing our hands.

Responding to our second Lent Challenge: ringing someone you haven't spoken since before Christmas:
